

Oh. My. God.

This is probably the most common extemporaneous prayer ever. It is odd that people change "God" to "gosh" to avoid swearing. Is this an expletive or a prayer? Maybe an expletive is prayer at its most raw: beyond an object or subject, past any niceties or formalities. Could this outburst be just a

cry of lament, or joy, or surprise? And is it possible that God can figure out what we mean, without any added details? Nothing fancy.

At the heart of extemporaneous prayer is our way of imagining God's presence and interaction with us. How do we address God in public? OMG. Seems to me, that's how Jesus prayed. "My God, my God..." from the cross. "OMG" from Mary at the tomb. Nothing fancy.

The best extemporaneous prayer is always available to us: Silence.

Adoration. Praise. Lament. Confession. All these prayers are pronounced without words, when we pause and breathe.

As a child I learned to pray with my hands folded and my eyes closed. Now when I pray with friends I find my hands open, like a bowl to catch my confession, to hold my fears and the prayers my friends have trusted me to pray.


An old man told me: "My father never said he loved me." My father. Our Father, who art in heaven. OMG, may he know your love. An old woman corrected me when I offered "a little prayer." "There is no little prayer," she said, hallowing each word. Hearing God's name in all creation.

Our bodies pray unceasingly in each breath. In a moment of silence we tune our ears to the whispering, chanting vigil of the earth praying in us, in vein and artery, keeping time with hearts opening and closing, breaking and healing. OMG, may I be vigilant to your prayer happening as I fumble and wonder what words to share.

OMG, OMG, in each word, I come close to you. OH: such awe, such bliss. MY: own, our own, your own: we belong to each other. GOD: such a small word for such wonderous life in us. Oh my God, my heart, my soul: breathe in me in this prayer, this pause I humbly offer in your name. AMEN.

COP28: UN Climate Change Young Adult Delegation




