

# Leading our children through the Season of Creation...



## ~ from...*Mother Natured* ~ *Nature Play Club* STICKY NATURE BRACELETS



## Show your kids how to create the ultimate charm bracelet with this sticky activity. They are sure to enjoy collecting treasures from the garden, and it's a great way to get them to spend intentional time outside looking closely at nature.

#### You will need:

- strips of cardboard trimmed to wrap around your child's wrist
- Double-sided tape
- Masking/cello tape

## Making the bracelets:

- 1. Help your children wrap double-sided tape around their strip of cardboard, then peel back the tape covering to expose the adhesive surface.
- 2. Secure the bracelet around your child's wrist with a piece of tape.
- 3. Set off on your nature walk with the bracelets you may like to stick to your own backyard or go to a nearby park.
- 4. As you walk around with your child, encourage them to pick out some small materials that interest them and stick it to the tape on their wrist bands.
- 5. Encourage your child to be gentle and respectful of the environment and consider the materials they collect carefully.
- 6. Ask your child about the materials they chose.

#### Play extensions:

- Create matching crowns or nature super hero cuffs.
- When your child has finished with their nature bracelet, place it in a compost bin and discuss why adding items to a compost helps the environment. (Make sure to remove the tape first.)
- Enjoy this activity seasonally and focus on collecting natural materials that celebrate the season.

## What are they learning?

- Exploring and investigating
- Developing new vocabulary and language skills
- Strengthening fine motor muscles, visual motor integration and control
- Use of descriptive language to name their collected materials
- Caring and showing respect for natural living things
- Broadening their understanding of the world
- Making predictions and generalizations about aspects of the natural world around them
- Making use of their senses to explore the natural environment
- Understanding the interdependence between land, plants and people.
